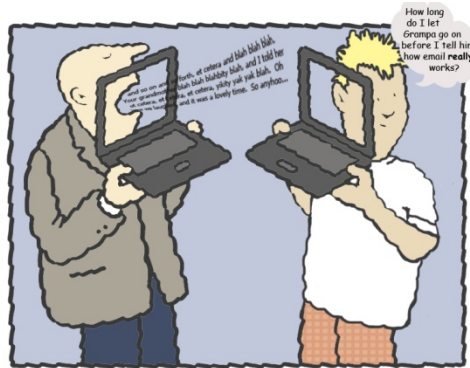
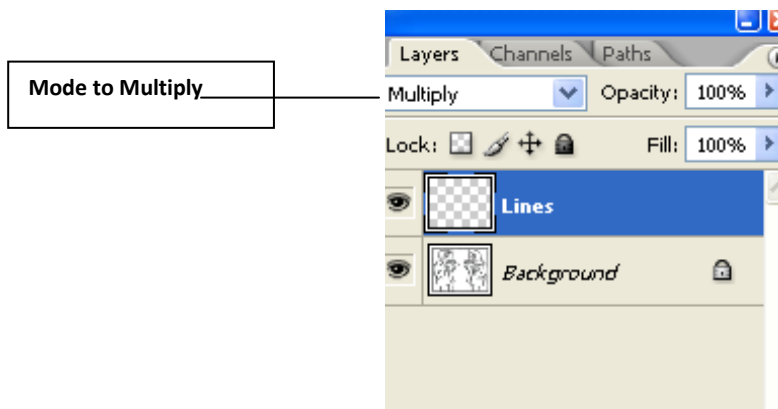


Photoshop Fun #6



- (1) Open **lineart.psd**.
- 2) Convert your Background layer to a regular layer. To do this click on the *Menu bar Layer/New/ Layer and name the layer "Lines"*.
- 3) Set your colors to the default by pressing **D**.
- 4) Create a new blank layer. Change the new layer to a Background layer by selecting *Layer/New/Background from Layer* and name it "Background".
- 5) Make the Lines layer active and change its Mode to *Multiply*. You won't see anything happen in the image, but this makes the white areas of your lines transparent, leaving on the black lines visible. This step makes it possible to select the areas of your line art.



- 6) Click on the Background layer and use any selection tool (the magic wand is the easiest) to select areas that you want to fill. Remember, you can select multiple areas by holding the *Shift*- key down and clicking.
- 7) Use any fill tool (bucket or gradient) to fill in the areas. (Keyboard shortcut: *Alt + Backspace*) Try using a pattern fill for fun.
- 8) Add some appropriate text to the image. Be creative and have fun.
- 9) Save your image as *IC6_First_Last.psd*. Save as *IC6_First_Last.jpg* and submit.
